Let's Talk Montessori

What we mean when we say...

Absorbent Mind

Absorbent mind refers to the time from birth to 6 when children are capable of absorbing huge amount of information about their environment through their senses.

Children are like sponges during the absorbent mind. They are capable of learning multiple languages, develop motor and cognitive skills, copy social skills from adults around them, and acquire expectations about how the world will treat them

The first phase from birth to three is the period of unconscious absorbent mind. The child learns to speak, gains control of the hands and learns to become independent from the adult.

The second phase from three to six is the conscious absorbent mind. The child has freedom to move purposefully, to choose, and to concentrate.

The child is soaking up information during the absorbent mind period. Montessori created a classroom environment that will fill up the sponges. There are lessons and materials in Math, Language, Geography, Botany, Zoology, Astronomy, Sensorial education, and activities in Practical life. Discoveries and questions are answered by use of the materials. Knowledge builds as children explore the classroom.

These sponges absorb everything in their environment. If students are learning about a subject at school, it would fill their need absorb by exploring more outside of school such as a trip to the museum, park, or library.

Progress Reports

The first term progress reports will be sent home on January 18. Please review your child's progress report carefully.

The Toddler progress reports will show the child's emotional, social, physical, and intellectual growth in school. It's a simple report of how your child is doing in school. The notations on the progress include: Always, Sometimes, and Never. A brief description of the their favorite tasks are included in the teacher's comments.

The Primary student's progress report will vary based on their level: Primary first year, Primary second year, and Primary third year. Your child's progress report is based on age and year of Montessori attendance. The notations on the progress report include "I" for Introduced, which means an initial presentation either during group or individual has been given. "P" for Practicing means the child is currently working on the material and is usually still dependent on the teacher's guidance to complete the task. "M" for mastered means the child has shown mastery of the material or lesson and is able to complete the task independently, as well as retell or reteach the lesson. Repetition for work is the key to mastery, so we encourage students to continue to practice their work everyday. Once mastered, the child may move up to the next level. The progress report shows a sequence of lessons and materials. Therefore, the report is also intended to guide parents as to what lesson your child will be taught next.

The Elementary progress report is unique for each grade level. The Montessori standards and California Education standards are integrated into the report card. No grade markings are used as each student should be working on mastering the concepts by the end of the school year. The progress report record and assess each student's academic and social development. Keep in mind that students may be at different levels of learning growth and may be completing subjects in a different grade level. The teacher's comments will give parents a summary of student's overall progress and achievement over a certain period of time.

In summary, the progress report is an important tool for parents to understand what and how your child is learning in school. It can show positive or possible developmental or academic problems. It is a valuable source of information to help guide parents and future teachers.

This progress report is an evaluation from September through December. Remember that each child learns at his or her own pace, but by providing an environment that encourages to learn, our devotion to be always teaching, our continuous observation, and our drive to make learning fun, our student's will truly love to learn from within and carry that habit for life.

Emergency Plan

MCDC takes proactive measures to protect the safety of all our students and staff. The actions taken during any type of emergency situation depend a great deal on the specifics of the incident. For example, MCDC may evacuate, lock down, or initiate a shelter-in-place response, according to the threat. The main objective is to protect the students and staff members. Most importantly, MCDC would follow direction from public safety officials.

A campus-wide drill takes place each month. This allows us to practice fire, earthquake, and lock down drills. MCDC also complies with CERT (Community Emergency Response Teams) and is prepared to perform during emergencies. Supplies of food, water, first aid, and tools are available in school. The teachers are assigned in teams such as command, damage assessment, search and rescue, first aid, sanitation, parent pick up, and supervision to assist our school in a major disaster. The main area for gathering is the back field. The students will remain in this area until it is safe to return in the building. Parents are discouraged to call the school during an emergency. Our priorities are to ensure that our school is safe, which may include calling for emergency personnel and attending to our students. We will be able to address parents as soon as the emergency situation is handled. We will call and/or email parents of our status.

Parents should register with ALERTOC for Huntington Beach to get instructions for emergencies in the area. An emergency section will be posted in our website.

One of the most important things parents can do to help is to make sure your child is signed in and out every day from school. The school and emergency personnel rely on this roster during emergency situations.
